**Nashua Symphony Orchestra & Chorus Announces 2007-08 Season  
Four finalists in search for Music Director showcased**

The 2007-08 season of the Nashua Symphony Orchestra & Chorus will take audiences through three centuries of Vienna, inside Soviet Russia, deep into the heart of mythology and folklore, to sunny Spain, to the brink of madness, and even to the very edges of the universe. While these destinations would seem to propose an impossible itinerary, we take up the challenge: at the Nashua Symphony Orchestra & Chorus we continue to strive to create concert programs that are intricately connected both to each other and to our audiences.

The NSO&C invites audiences to connect this season – through inspiring live performances – to music’s magnificent history and its glorious present, to the four dynamic guest conductors who are finalists in our international quest for Maestro Nash’s successor, to the thriving, curious, engaged community of people who make up our audiences. Connect the life of Mozart to the ideas of Ives, Handel’s elegant control to the thrilling excess of early Stravinsky, Barber’s lush imagery to Beethoven’s self-image, Schubert’s despair to Bernstein’s exuberant hope.

The 2007-08 season will also feature the return of violin virtuoso Irina Muresanu – who wowed audiences this past April in Brahms’ Violin Concerto – this time to play the beloved Violin Concerto of Samuel Barber under the direction of Jonathan McPhee. Plus, audiences will be treated to the Nashua Symphony Orchestra debut of pianist Judith Gordon, an electrifying veteran of the Celebrity Series of Boston and the Boston Pops, to perform Ravel’s Piano Concerto in G Major.
